

Training Access Program

The Training Access Program is a limited scholarship-style offering designed to help make training more accessible for clients who may not currently be able to enroll at full cost.

This program provides partial financial support toward select training services for approved applicants. It is intended to support clients who are looking for help with obedience and general manners training and who are ready to actively participate in the training process.

Because available spots are limited, not all applicants will be selected.

Who This Program Is For

The Training Access Program is intended for clients who:

- are seeking help with obedience or general manners training
- are unable to comfortably access training at full price
- are ready to participate consistently in training
- are willing to practice between sessions and stay engaged in the process
- are a resident of Highlands County, FL or have spoken with the trainer directly to ensure their location is within the service area

This program is meant to support clients who want to put the training to use and are prepared to follow through.

What This Program May Apply To

Approved applicants may receive a partial discount toward select eligible training programs. This program does not provide full scholarships, and not all services may be eligible for discounted placement. Training recommendations are based on the dog, the goals involved, and current availability.

What This Program Does Not Cover

At this time, the Training Access Program is available only for obedience and general manners training.

The following are not eligible through this program:

- aggression
- reactivity
- fear-based cases
- resource guarding
- behavior modification cases
- cases requiring a custom treatment plan for significant behavior concerns

Due to the complexity and liability involved in behavior cases, those concerns are not currently in the program.

How the Application Process Works

- Complete the application form fully and thoughtfully.
- Applications are reviewed for scope, fit, completeness, and availability.
- Selected applicants may be invited to complete a consultation before final scholarship decisions are made.
- If approved, the client will be offered a discounted placement in an eligible training program, along with any related participation terms.

Submitting an application does not guarantee approval.

Application Requirements

Applications must be completed fully in order to be considered. Please note:

- all required sections must be completed
- open-ended questions must be answered thoughtfully
- brief, incomplete, or rushed responses may result in the application not being considered
- additional follow-up may be requested if clarification is needed

The application process is meant to help identify the best fit for these limited spots and to ensure the program is being used in a thoughtful and productive way.

Participation Expectations

Clients who receive support through the Training Access Program are expected to:

- schedule and attend sessions consistently
- communicate clearly about scheduling or issues
- follow standard business policies
- participate in homework and follow-through between sessions
- remain actively engaged in the training process

Because these spots are limited, discounted placements must be used responsibly and consistently.

Important Notes

- Scholarship spots are limited and may not always be available.
- A waitlist may be used when all current spots are full.
- This program offers partial discounts only. Full scholarships are not offered at this time.
- A paid consultation may be required before final approval.
- Approval is based on fit, case type, participation readiness, and current availability.

Scholarship Participation Expectations

Scholarship spots are offered in limited numbers to help increase access to training support for clients who may not otherwise be able to participate at full cost.

Because these spots are limited, recipients are expected to use them actively, consistently, and respectfully. The goal of the scholarship program is to provide meaningful support that can be put to good use, not simply to reduce cost.

Clients receiving scholarship support are expected to:

1. Attend sessions consistently

Scholarship clients should schedule and use their sessions in a reasonably consistent manner so the training process can remain productive.

In most cases, sessions should not be spaced more than two weeks apart unless discussed and approved in advance.

2. Communicate about scheduling and changes

Clients are expected to respond to scheduling messages, confirm appointments as needed, and communicate promptly if an issue comes up.

Clear communication helps make sure the training plan stays on track and that limited scholarship spots are being used effectively.

3. Follow standard business policies

Scholarship clients are still expected to follow all standard business policies, including cancellation and rescheduling expectations.

4. Participate in homework and follow-through

Training progress depends heavily on what happens between sessions.

Clients receiving scholarship support are expected to participate in assigned homework and practice to the best of their ability, and to stay engaged in the training process between sessions.

This does not require perfection, but it does require effort and follow-through.

5. Stay engaged in the training process

Scholarship spots are intended for clients who are ready to actively participate in helping their dog. Clients should be willing to:

- practice between sessions
- ask questions when needed
- communicate honestly about challenges
- and stay involved in the plan we are working through together

6. Use the scholarship spot responsibly

Because scholarship availability is limited, spots are meant for clients who are in a position to actively use the support offered.

If a client repeatedly misses sessions, goes long periods without scheduling, becomes unresponsive, or does not meaningfully participate in the program, the scholarship may no longer be the right fit.

Important Note

Scholarship support may be reviewed and adjusted if participation expectations are not being met. This may include situations such as:

- repeated late cancellations or no-shows
- long gaps between sessions without prior discussion
- repeated lack of communication
- or ongoing lack of follow-through that prevents the program from being used effectively

Whenever possible, concerns will be discussed before changes are made. However, scholarship spots are limited and must be used in a way that supports both the client and the sustainability of the program.
